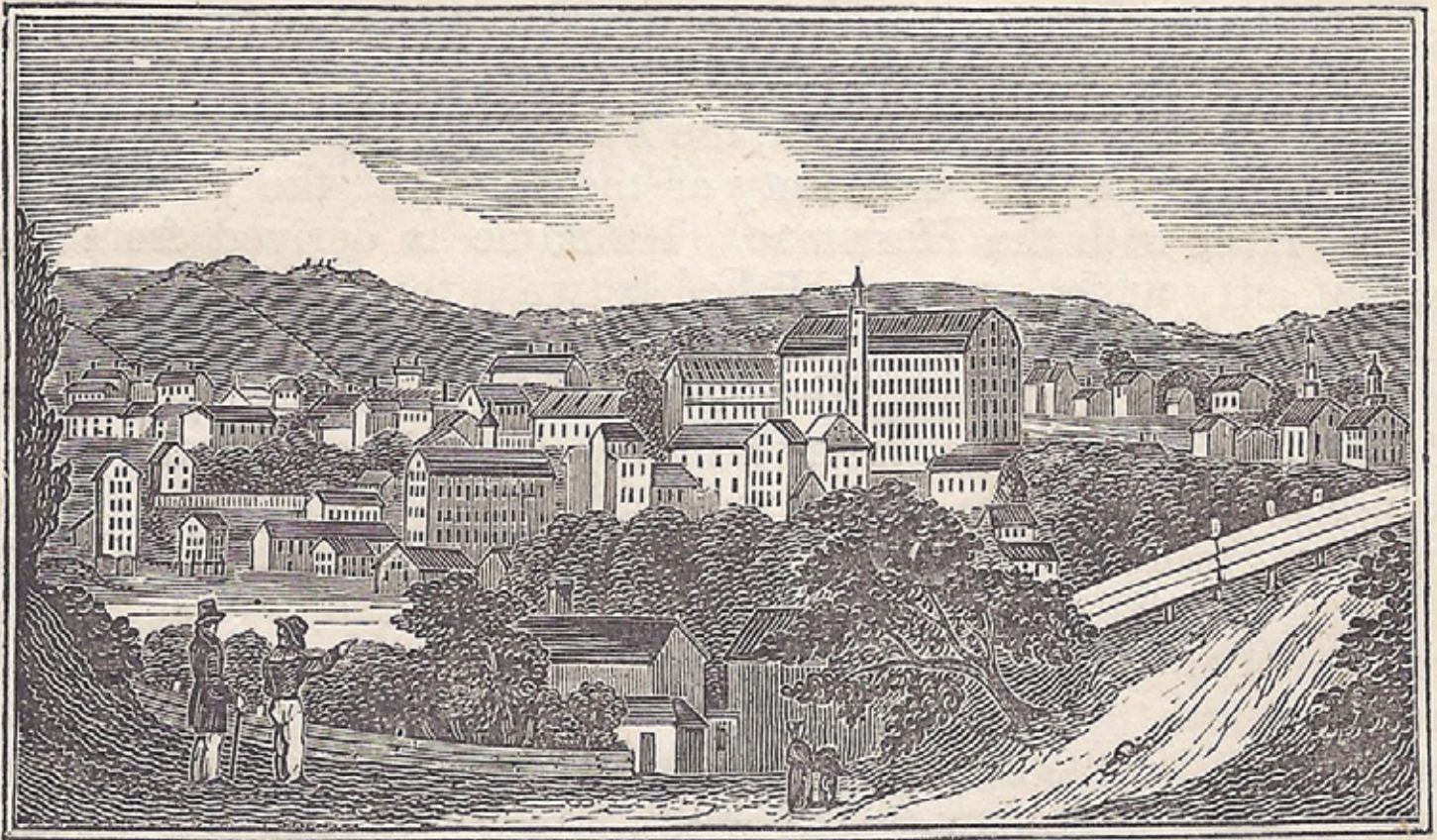

# Executive Director's Report

2018 was a transformative year for the Amesbury Carriage Museum in so many ways. We offered a full calendar of programs, worked behind the scenes to strengthen the organization, moved into a suite of offices, and accepted a gift of space that will become our first public location – *the Industrial History Center at Mill 2*. Each of these are great accomplishments – together they make for a truly remarkable year.

With our program offerings, we celebrated the 350th anniversary of the incorporation of Amesbury. The museum presented unique programs and collaborated with others – together this full roster of events made the anniversary both memorable and fun. The Mass Memories Road Show included more than 100 people who shared photographs and stories that are now part of a permanent, on-line community scrapbook. The 2018 Carriagetown Car Show was a huge success and included eight Amesbury-bodied cars ranging from a 1903 Locomobile to a 1929 Franklin – all amazing examples of the work of Amesbury workers. Our program series included presentations by local historians, professional scholars, and tours developed by our Industrial Survey team.

Our school programs expanded in scope and content. A volunteer committee focused our offerings on a millyard tour and *Walk along the Powow River*. In the spring, we hosted over 200 students for our tour. We are building upon the 2017 Amesbury Education Foundation project – *A Museum without Walls*. We use the surrounding landscape to provide history lessons for students and strengthen their sense of place. And most importantly, the content is now part of the museum website and available for all to use.

Our museum operations became more firmly established and more clearly focused. We found a home for the Salisbury Point Railroad Historical Society collections, while retaining the materials that told an Amesbury story. After two years as a guest in the offices of the Amesbury Chamber of Commerce, we moved into an office suite with space for library and historical collections, staff desks, and an area for our meetings. We improved several displays of objects on view in community locations and prepared a storefront display in the windows of the Counting House on Market Square. With all these activities, we added a part time position of campaign and program assistant and welcomed Bonnie Brady to our staff.

It has been a thrill and an honor to be part of the organization. We are active, mission-focused, and effectively building programs for the future. It is nearly impossible to adequately recognize the support we receive from our community. From all of us involved with the museum, we are grateful to YOU, our community, for the support you provide and for your interest in what we do.

2018 was a remarkable year. Onward we go!

## The Industrial History Center at Mill 2

Thank you Greg Jardis! Because of your generous donation, the Amesbury Carriage Museum now has a location for our museum facility and a space for our public programs. This gift of 2,500 feet in a historic mill building will become our venue for public programs, changing and long term exhibits, and the place to orient visitors and students to Amesbury history. Your gift is truly transformative!

The space is perfect in so many ways. Located on the lower level of Amesbury Industrial Supply, our doors will open onto the millyard. An entry plaza will draw people to our space. Tours can begin here, school groups can gather, public programs will be presented, and community activities will have a home.

The gift allows us to focus our fundraising on the capital needs for the space. Once we have built out the space, our challenge is simply to sustain our operations. We will not have a lease, a mortgage, or common use expenses. Our vision—a dream that has been on the table for over 30 years—is now reachable.

Greg made this offer in July—and little by little through the remainder of the year, the project took form. Architect Greg Colling of Merrimack Design Architects worked with a planning team to develop a design. We secured price estimates from local contractors. And, we began to lay the foundation for a fundraising campaign—an effort that is ongoing.

This amazing space supports our vision to establish a place for programs and exhibits. Soon—we will truly have a place where community stories will begin.
