About the program: This program is designed to serve as an introduction to Industrial Archaeology and will feature presentations and tours of historic industrial buildings and nearby landscape elements. This approach to history is a dynamic way to understand the story of your community and deepen your sense of place. Supporting materials will provide information about Amesbury's industrial history and offer open-ended questions and topics for further inquiry on your own.

The program schedule includes:

- **Morning presentation - *Development of American Textile Mill Buildings in the Nineteenth Century.*** Sara Wermiel, historian and historic preservation consultant, will provide an overview of the design and construction of textile mills.
- **Tour of Mill 2, built 1825-27 and currently the location of Amesbury Industrial Supply.** Participants will take a guided tour through this mill and explore elements highlighted in the morning program.

- **Afternoon presentation** - *Hydro to Steam...Who’s Got the Power? The Evolution of Industrial Power Systems*. Photographer and historian, Steve Dunwell (author of *Run of the Mill*) will provide an overview of the development of industrial power from water wheels to steam engines.
- **Tour of the Powow River**. Participants will explore areas along the river that reflect the evolution of industrial power in Amesbury.
- **Wrap up and end**. We will end the tour at Silvaticus Brewery – located in an 1872 boiler house. You are invited to linger with program participants and enjoy locally-made brews!

Additional Information:

- **Lunch option**. For a small additional fee, a pizza lunch will be available at Flatbread Pizza. (Beverages not included in the fee. Individuals order and pay for the beverage of their choice.)
- **Parking**. Please park in city parking lots on Water or Friend Streets. Each a short walk to our venue.
